Here are a few highlights of what's happening in our community:

- Triangle Park is now officially a park! It's been years in the making, but the Council voted to rezone the "Triangle" from a right-of-way to a park. By doing so, this space will be reserved for recreation and community gatherings.

## Meet Linnea Bailey, Woodcreek City Council



*Linnea Bailey is a Woodcreek City Council representative. We’ll continue featuring Council and Mayor profiles monthly in this newsletter.*

### **How long have you lived in Woodcreek, and what do you enjoy about living here?**

I have lived here for 20 years, since March of 2005. The thing I like most about living here is that it feels like I live in a park with lush trees, quiet and safe surroundings filled with deer and birds, plus a spreading big lawn out back that the golf course takes care of. The kind of place I would go for vacation, if I didn't already live here.

### **What is your profession?**

I am a retired accountant. My professional life included serving as Chief Financial Officer for a land development company and a major home builder. Locally, I worked as an accountant for a Blanco paving company. In 2007-2008, I was City Secretary for Woodcreek and completed the County Clerk program, which is a two-year associate degree from the University of North Texas for municipal clerks, city secretaries, and city management.

### **Why did you run for City Council?**

My decision to run for city council began with my interest in improving the city's roads. When I moved here, the excellent quality of the roads, compared to those in other surrounding communities, contributed to my decision to live here. However, after 17 years, most of the roads were in poor condition. I was chair of the Platinum Road Panel and then ran for council, where I could do the most good. With the passage of a general obligation bond and a competitive bid, nine miles of road were completed in 2023.

### What have you learned in your time serving on City Council?

I have learned that often there are many ways to achieve the same goal. Cooperation and compromise are probably the best ways to achieve optimal results, but that's not always the process.

### What are some of Woodcreek's biggest opportunities and challenges in the coming months and years?

There are many opportunities and challenges ahead for Woodcreek, but I'll focus on those that fall within my fields of construction and accounting. Funds remain from the 2023 General Obligation bond. Seal coat is a process that is applied to new asphalt after 17 to 24 months. The process improves appearance and would extend the life of the road by 3-5 years. A portion of the remaining General Obligation bond funds could be used to extend the life of our roads and would be in keeping with the voters' intent when approving the 2023 road bond.


I see rising property taxes as one of our biggest challenges. Because home values have doubled in the past 10 years, property taxes have also doubled. Even though Woodcreek has implemented measures to mitigate the rapid increase of property taxes (No New Revenue and increased exemption for seniors), actual property tax collections in Woodcreek have increased by 107% in the past 10 years, even though the population has only increased by 27% (45% tax increase over 5 years, with a 17% increase in population).

On June 16, 2025, the State of Texas initiated the largest property tax reduction in Texas history. Woodcreek should follow suit by exploring ways to reduce property tax bills. The state bill suggests up to 20% increase in homeowner's exemption.

### What is something interesting that you want residents to know about you?

I can throw a mean frisbee with height, distance, and (usually) with accuracy. Coincidentally, my lab Lola is an excellent catcher of a high-flying frisbee as long as I throw it where she can catch it.

Different alerts include general Woodcreek news, City Council and committee agendas and meetings, and city job openings. In an emergency (like weather or fire), it's an essential way to stay safe and informed.
